Sherri Hope Culver serves as Director of the Center for Media and Information Literacy (CMIL) at Temple University, USA where she is Associate Professor in the Klein College of Media and Communication. Sherri's teaching and consulting focuses on media literacy and media institutions, with a focus on children's media. She serves as vice-chair of the global Media and Information Literacy Alliance, a UNESCO-led alliance of over 600 organizations from 80 countries. Sherri produces and hosts the podcast Kids Talk Media.

Dr. H.E. Princess Karina Bagration is the Rector and Co-Founder of the Swiss Institute of Cultural Diplomacy. With more than 20 years of teaching and scientific experience at the university level, she has made a name for herself in the field of humanities. The Rector actively contributes to the development of British, American and Swiss crosscultural projects. In addition, she has contributed to numerous philanthropic pursuits connecting the world of sport and school education, including the Special Olympics. She also developed the Peace and Sport Educational Kit project concept, (Peace and Sport International Organization, Monaco).
